**A Message to Our Community**

Ovation, last year's celebration of Saint John's 225th and Rothesay's 150th anniversaries, organized by your Community Foundation, was a 2010 highlight for the Foundation and our community. Thanks to the dedication of scores of volunteers, led by Penny Milligan, and the generosity of sponsors, participants, and performing & visual artists, it raised the profile of our Community Foundation and the arts in our community, as well as nearly \$150,000 for our permanent endowments. They continue to grow despite the global and local economic challenges we face. The market value of our assets has improved as continued gifts from public-spirited donors and investments by our community partners brings our total assets to \$8.6M at fiscal year-end, Oct. 31, 2010.

The Foundation Board continues to be dedicated to prudent management of its assets and vigilant in keeping organizational costs to a minimum (about 1.5% of our endowments). Our priorities in changing times include: continuing to encourage philanthropy by building our endowments, continued support of a wide range of local charitable causes and taking leadership in Greater Saint John with projects like Ovation and Vital Signs, our annual Report on Greater Saint John's quality of life.

Last year, a number of other special events took place like the second Annual Brian Lund Memorial Fund Casino, the second Annual "Rachael's Music by The Bay" in support of the Rachael Dawn Duffley Memorial Scholarship Fund and the Sixth Annual Paul Grannan Golf Tournament in support of the Paul Grannan Fund. We also welcomed the Carleton Kirk Lodge Fund, the Dickson Family Fund, the Dr. Joseph & Renée Arditti Family Neurosciences Fund and the Suzanne Doyle-Yerxa Awards Fund.

One of the Foundation's most significant contributions to our community was the production of our fifth annual report, "Greater Saint John's Vital Signs, 2010". Visit our website, [www.saint-john-foundation.nb.ca](http://www.saint-john-foundation.nb.ca) to become more familiar with local health, demographic, educational, environmental, economic and other data, which we produce as a public service.


Over fifty grants were made last year to a wide variety of charitable causes totaling \$233,300, thanks to the work of our Grants Committee. It is an honour and privilege to serve our community, along with our dedicated team, knowing we have made a total of \$5.2 Million in grants cumulatively since 1976. We are grateful to our volunteer board and the many contributors to our Foundation whose support makes Greater Saint John a better place to live.

A Gala Evening celebrating 2010 anniversaries and arts and culture, took place November 6, 2010 at the Marco Polo Cruise Terminal, thanks to generous support from all sectors of the community. "Ovation" attracted over 700 guests to celebrate community anniversaries, arts & culture and benefit the charities supported

by the Greater Saint John Community Foundation. The community celebration offered an opportunity for Greater Saint John to unite and come together in a positive and celebratory conclusion to 2010. Some generous sponsors kindly provided tickets for those who might not have the financial means to attend otherwise.

Ovation attracted over 57 sponsors of cash and in kind donations who, along with generous contributors of over 110 auction items, some valued in the thousands of dollars, made the event a great success. Over 70 individuals and groups graciously donated their talent for the evening, helping keep the event's budget to a bare minimum. The



Foundation went solo, not receiving any support from governments or Saint John 225. The entire evening gala channelled proceeds of nearly \$150,000 to the Foundation's endowment funds which in turn, will generate income year after year to local charitable causes.

## Greater Saint John's Vital Signs®

The Greater Saint John Community Foundation's "Greater Saint John's 2010 Vital Signs®", its fifth unique report on the quality of life in Greater Saint John, is an annual community check-up, part of a national effort conducted by community foundations across Canada, measuring the vitality of our cities, identifying trends, and assigning grades in ten areas critical to quality of life (Population, Housing, Work, Belonging & Leadership, Safety, Health, Getting Started, Environment, Learning, Arts and Culture and the Gap Between Rich and Poor).



It is compiled from many national, provincial and local sources, census data such as, unemployment rates, obesity and cancer rates, household recycling rate, housing costs, educational attainment, air quality, crime rates and poverty rates. The foundation funds the \$15,000 project as a public service to highlight issues of local importance, and as a planning tool for community groups, leaders, businesses and researchers.

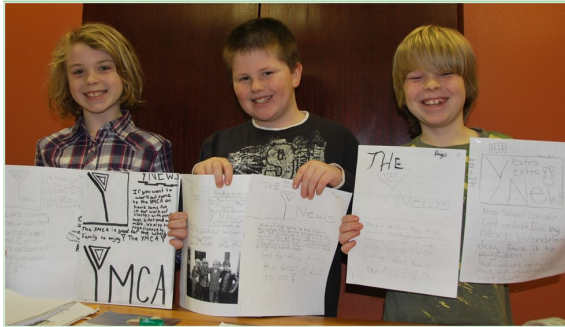
