


## GRANT RECIPIENTS 2012

AIDS SAINT JOHN (Anniversary Grant)	Sex Trade Action Committee applied for a Sex Trade Outreach Program to work on a grassroots level, in collaboration with other community organizations, to assist sex workers to rebuild their lives on their terms.	\$30,000
Ability New Brunswick	Rehabilitation Counselling for young adults will target 16 - 30 year olds with mobility disabilities to transition from high school to employment or to post-secondary education.	\$2,000
The Boys & Girls Club of Saint John Inc.	Looking to improve their enrolment for their upcoming summer program.	\$3,000
Canadian Liver Foundation -Saint John Chapter	Looking for funding to host educational and support sessions throughout 2012 - 2013.	\$1,000
Centenary Queen Square Adult Care Centre	Both programs provide a safe environment and nutritious meals for clients in need.	\$6,000
CNIB	Looking to expand their AVL group to provide educational materials and counselling to people who are blind or partially blind.	\$2,000

Leadership In Volunteerism (L.I.V.)	Support for the start-up of the Leadership In Volunteerism group started at the Rothesay High school to encourage High School Teens to Volunteer	\$675
Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada, Atlantic Division	The Funding Assistance Program was established to help with the financial burden of people with MS.	\$1,500
Nature Conservancy of Canada, The	Musquash Trailblazers event - engage volunteers to maintain the Estuary footpath and they are hoping to install permanent stairs at the head of Black Beach trail. Shampers Bluff Weed Pull - teach volunteers about the threat of an alien weed invading the Reserve.	\$2,000
The Nature Trust of New Brunswick.	Programs designed to engage youth in nature conservancy	\$2,500
New Brunswick Competitive Festival of Music	Workshops will be offered to schools to help students further their musical education.	\$2,000
New Brunswick International Sculpture Symposium Inc.	Hosting a six week event called Sculpture Saint John. Six world class sculptures have been chosen to create granite sculptures from local stone. Once completed, the surrounding municipalities will each own a sculpture to be put on public display.	\$5,000

Pasage Saint John Inc.	Funds are needed to purchase educational materials (DVD and literature) for 2 target ages - 9 - 13 years of age and high school aged.	\$1,000
Port City Dance Academy	After School Arts Program for 9 - 12 years olds to learn dance and art at no cost. 18 children will be able to participate in the program.	\$1,500
PRO Kids	Non for profit program operating out of Leisure Services that matches children and teens to organized, registered activities.	\$20,000
Quality Learning NB	Quality Storytents is an outdoor, drop in program that provides a fun place for families to read or borrow books. Materials consist of canopies, blankets, books and a light snack.	\$2,000
The Resource Centre for Youth of Greater Saint John	Funding for The Zone & Teen Vibe which are programs that help teens socialize with peers and provides them with adult mentoring.	\$5,000
Saint John Christmas Exchange	They provide food to ensure that families in the Greater Saint John area have a Christmas dinner.	\$2,000
Saint John Community Loan Fund	They would like to establish the Learning and Enterprise Exchange, which is a new building that will house non-for-profit agencies and living quarters in the top floor for low income families.	\$15,000
Saint John Free Public Library	Looking for funding to purchase large print books and recorded books for vision impaired patrons.	\$4,000
Saint John Regional Hospital Foundation	Looking to purchase 12 new heart/lung machines for the New Brunswick Heart Centre.	\$2,000
The Saint John School Milk Fund.	They supply milk daily to needy children in Saint John Schools during the winter.	\$1,500
Saint John String Quartet	Quartet in the Classroom is to introduce classical music and musicians to school aged children in Greater Saint John.	\$3,000
Saint John Theatre Company	Community Outreach Program - school children can attend performances for an affordable price.	\$4,000
