



Organization (Grant)	Description of Project or Program
527 Simonds Air Cadet Squadron (\$1,200)	To encourage and enrich the youth development movement dedicated proactively in developing well adjusted, civic minded youth to undertake leadership roles in Canada and beyond.
Ability New Brunswick (\$1,800)	We work with seniors who have a mobility disability as well as their families, etc. Rehabilitation Counsellors help plan for as much independence as possible, including identifying needs, exploring options, setting and reaching goals, developing plans, identifying solutions to problems, making community links and mobilizing resources, services and supports.
Alzheimer Society of New Brunswick (\$2,900)	Inform and educate those recently diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and related dementia as well as their friends and families. Healthcare professionals are also welcomed.
Alzheimer Society of New Brunswick (\$5,000)	The Alzheimer Cafe, a program originally launched in the UK, is a program that offers both professional and peer support, education, light refreshments and entertainment.
Anglican Parish of West Saint John Saint Jude and St Lukes (\$450)	From May - August we provide a weekly BBQ lunch to people in 2 Lower West Side neighbourhoods. This provides a meal to those who might not be able to afford one as well as a sense of community.
Big Brothers Big Sisters of Saint John (\$2,000)	The Big Group Mentoring program will offer program activities designed to engage Bigs and Littles who are matched and waiting list Littles in larger group activities.
Boys and Girls Club of Saint John, Inc. (\$2,000)	A 10 week Summer Day Camp for struggling parents/ guardians needing assistance in this ongoing battle to receive childcare. Children will be engaged in activities that challenge and enrich their minds, bodies and spirits, nurture their self-esteem and develop valuable skills for life.
Campus Radio Saint John Inc. (\$1,600)	Expanding local news/spoken word in the Greater Saint John community and the campus and community radio sector to produce high quality programming.
Canadian National Institute for the Blind (\$2,000)	An estimated 5,000 people in the Saint John region are living with chronic vision loss (expected to double in the next 20 years). CNIB Orientation and Mobility specialists will provide white canes and teach individuals with vision loss of all ages to travel confidently in their home, work and throughout the Greater Saint John Community.
Carleton-Kirk Complex Inc. (\$7,500)	A new larger elevator to better serve our residents and family members of the nursing home. The current elevator is too small to accommodate today's wheelchairs and stretchers.
Centenary-Queen Square Care Centres, Inc (\$4,000)	We provide high quality individualized social, physical, mental, and emotional support for adults and children in the greater Saint John area.
Conservation Council of New Brunswick (\$5,000)	Expanding our Buy Local database by reflecting growing local food initiatives in the Greater Saint John area, including community gardens, workshops, mentoring, etc. A phone app for local food, enabling consumers to locate food producers on a map, and to be notified if they are near a local food producer.
Crescent Valley Resource Centre (\$2,600)	Storytents is an outdoor, drop-in program that provides a fun, safe place for families to read or borrow books. Since 2003, children have read over 41,000 books in this program.
Crescent Valley Resource Centre Inc. (\$2,000)	Funds will allow us to provide nutritious meals and snacks for program participants. We will also provide incentives and prizes for participants. The CVRC offers a variety of free programs and services that are based around or include healthy eating opportunities. (averaging over 200 attendees each month)
Forest Hill Rehabilitation Centre Foundation Inc. (\$2,500)	Stan Cassidy Kiwanis House Furnishings and Equipment Project will outfit a fully-accessible housekeeping hostel next to the Stan Cassidy Centre.

Fundy Shores Community Playground Committee (\$3,000)	Replacement of current playground located at Fundy Shores School, Dipper Harbour, NB. Existing structure was dismantled in December due to it's age and wasn't passing safety inspections.
Gentle Path Counselling Services Ltd. (\$1,300)	Anger management group programs for children "I'm not Bad...I'm just Mad" for children ages 8 - 10 years old and Seeing Red for children ages 10 - 12 years old. These programs are free of cost, allowing mental health services regardless of financial abilities of families.
Hampton Alliance for Lifelong Learning (\$1,100)	The Celebrate Baby program captures parents during their infant's first year of life, and provides opportunities to strengthen parenting skills through activities and information sessions, to help become more confident as a parent and cultivate a healthy attachment during the baby's first critical year of life.
Horizon Health Network (\$700)	Client Support Fund makes a small difference in the lives of individuals living in poverty, by purchasing bus tokens (which often provide transportation to a medical appointment or job interview), or to offset the cost of prescription medications or other health care needs.
Hospice of Greater Saint John, Inc. (\$3,000)	Bobby's Hospice will purchase a high heat commercial dishwasher to improve the infection control practices and minimize the spread of disease.
Imperial Theatre Inc. (\$10,000)	To commemorate the 100th anniversary of Saint John's Imperial Theatre, we plan to renovate the front of the building, including restoration of the facade masonry and replacement of the main entrance doors. An "unveiling" ceremony of this work will form part of the centennial celebrations.
InterAction Theatre Company Inc. (\$7,500)	Community Arts Education Studio provides year long partnerships with communities in need and professional artists and educators by offering a safe haven to learn and develop social skills through the performing arts.
L'Arche Saint John (\$700)	Development of leadership and advocacy skills of 2 of our members (with and without an intellectual disability), to engage in and share their experience of the L'Arche Canada National Assembly in Vancouver.
Loch Lomond Villa Foundation Inc (\$7,500)	Providing accessible transportation to nearly 500 seniors living in the Loch Lomond Villa complex; providing seniors challenged by age or disability with easy access to get to medical appointments, family gatherings, or special activity outings.
New Brunswick Association for Community Living Inc./Association du Nouveau-Brunswick pour l'intégration communautaire Inc. (\$1,200)	"Connections to Community" assists youth and adults who have an intellectual disability to be included in their community of Saint John by becoming involved in recreation, leisure and volunteer activities that match their interests and choices.
New Brunswick Competitive Festival of Music (\$1,500)	Expansion of the Music Festival's annual programming to include additional in-school workshops, especially focusing on schools where transportation availability may be prohibitive to their participation in the festival.
New Brunswick International Sculpture Symposium Inc. (\$5,000)	An International Sculpture Symposium which provides world class affordable, public art for public spaces in Saint John and surrounding communities. The funding that we are applying for here is for 2013 (year of preparation) and covers equipment and promotion costs in support of Sculpture 2014.
New Brunswick Youth Orchestra Foundation Inc.- String Quartet (\$900)	"Quartet in the Classroom" introduces classical music and musicians to school aged children in NB. The Saint John String Quartet play to over 10,000 children in schools presenting programs specially designed for appropriate age groups. "Marvelous Mozart", "The Musical Petting Zoo", "The Lost String Quartet", are examples of the innovated presentations.
New Brunswick Youth Orchestra, Inc. (\$1,200)	15 expert professional orchestral musicians from Saint John and other NB communities will each provide a total of 5 days of instrumental sectional training and coaching on the 2013-14 repertoire to NBYO members between August - November 2013, culminating in a performance of the 2013-14 NBYO repertoire for up to 1,500 area patrons and kicking off 50th Anniversary celebrations of the NBYO.
New Brunswick Youth Orchestra, Inc. (\$10,000)	Sistema NB, a social program that provides free music instruction to under-served children from grades 1 - 6 for 3 hours/day, every day after school. Each child who participates receives an instrument and becomes part of something big and special. An orchestra!
Opera New Brunswick Inc. (\$1,600)	Educational outreach in the form of workshops and student performance, allowing students to experience opera.
Pasage Saint John Inc. (\$350)	Requesting funding support for computers to support our youth drug education programs.

Port City Dance Academy Inc. (\$600)	The Accordance Program is an innovative, dance-based after school arts program for disadvantaged children in grades 2-5. Promoting wellness, the program's curriculum includes: traditional, classical, and contemporary dance techniques; fitness; exploration of other art forms, and creative expression.
Positive Recreation Opportunities for Kids (P.R.O. Kids) (\$5,000)	Operating out of the Leisure Services Department of the City of Saint John we match children and teens up to (and including) the age of 18 with organized, registered recreation activities. P.R.O. Kids places children from Saint John, Rothesay, Quispamsis, and Grand Bay-Westfield.
Quaco Historical & Library Society Inc. (\$15,000)	Renovations and refurbishment of existing building and archives room to develop a community multipurpose room that is currently in demand in the St Martin's area.
READ Saint John Ltd. (\$600)	Plant a Seed for Literacy Program - this year we will include beautifying a piece of Harbour Passage as well as Lorne Middle School. We will provide seeds, flowers/pots, soil, etc., with Lorne Middle School students.
Roots of Empathy (\$5,000)	Our mission is to build caring, peaceful and civil societies through the development of empathy in children and adults, by strengthening the preventative factors associated with children's mental health issues and by promoting children's mental wellness.
Royal Canadian Legion Norton Branch #76 (\$4,000)	To construct a roof over the existing wheelchair ramp to prevent ice and snow falling on the people using the ramp to enter and exit the building; and to extend the existing platform to accommodate more people at one time.
Saint John Arts Centre Inc. (\$2,400)	Establishing the studio requirements to support 6 yearly 6-week sessions in Digital Art and Animation for youth and young adults, following the model of our very successful Portfolio Development program.
Saint John Chorale (core group) (\$500)	The non-profit 75-voice Symphony Chorus (over 1/2 being Seniors), plan to produce and perform in Handel's Messiah on Dec. 20th, 2013; hire and feature 19 Saint John area orchestral and 4 solo performers.
Saint John Community Christmas Exchange (\$2,900)	We are dedicated to ensuring that needy families in the Saint John and surrounding areas receive food for their Christmas dinner. We co-ordinate the names of those in need so that supporting churches and service groups avoid duplication.
Saint John Community Loan Fund (\$4,000)	A 3 year partnership with the Urban Core Support Network, working with low income women in priority neighbourhoods, providing them with leadership training and mentoring which will assist them in developing skills that will facilitate their access to opportunities to strengthen and/or increase their engagement in their communities.
Saint John Human Development Council - Safe Harbour (\$1,000)	Safe Harbour Youth House project is creating an online and off line engagement tool around the issues of homelessness and a connection tool for Homeless Youth who may not know where to reach out to.
Saint John Human Development Council Inc.- Star Network (\$1,000)	The STAR Network is a network of non-profit agencies created as an action committee through the Saint John Human Development Council's chairing of the Homelessness Steering Committee for the direct purpose of fighting and eliminating homelessness in Saint John.
Saint John Human Development Council - Safe Harbour (\$12,000)	Safe Harbour Transitional Youth Services is being established in response to the identified need of addressing youth homelessness in the southern NB region. Safe Harbour will provide an emergency housing program (90-180 days) as part of a youth-serving continuum in collaboration with other non-profits that serve at risk youth.
Saint John Regional Hospital Foundation Inc. (\$2,400)	Raising \$850,000 to purchase 8 new pieces of equipment for our Neurosurgery Program, will allow us to perform 360 degree minimally invasive neurosurgery. This will take cranial incisions from 6 inches in diameter down to 1 inch in diameter.
Saint John School Milk Fund (\$2,200)	This fund provides milk to 14 schools in the Anglophone South district (624 children) 5 days per week during November - March each year.
Saint John Volunteer Centre Inc. (\$2,000)	It is our intention through the Engaging Young Women in Leadership Roles project, to increase the representation of young women 17-25 on local Boards and Committees. The participants will benefit from hands on experience, basic governance training, and mentoring for an 'internship' on a Board or Committee which will increase their effectiveness as volunteers and leaders.

Saint John YMCA-YWCA (\$5,000)	Integrated Day Camp - An opportunity for all children to participate in the day camp experience, regardless of mental or physical limitations. Rainbows Program - A peer support program for children whose parents have died, divorced or separated, offered free of charge to children from St. Stephen - Sussex in the school district and childcare centres. Camp Glenburn Campership Program - Allowing financially disadvantaged families the opportunity to send their child to an overnight camp during the summer.
Senior Citizens Services Saint John Inc. - City Market Seniors (\$1,700)	Provides dignified emergency food access, food skills programs and education and engagement opportunities for people of all ages. To explore a model of shared workspaces for social innovators and social mission-visionaries who face capacity and resource challenges.
Seniors' Resource Centre (\$400)	Update information on recreation and discount opportunities for seniors.
Shining Horizon Therapeutic Riding Incorporated (\$7,500)	Fundraising to purchase a Riding for Disabled Simulator which will enable Therapeutic Riding sessions at different or simultaneous locations, to expand the program to others, and to expand the therapeutic benefits to existing participants.
Symphony New Brunswick Inc. (\$5,000)	A program that integrates school activities with orchestra concerts. A teaching package reflecting symphony concerts will be distributed to schools, followed by a visit from a performance orchestra group; meanwhile the class is encouraged to respond to aspects of the program through complimentary art forms such as painting, theatre, video creation, photography, etc.
The Big Rothesay Read (\$1,300)	To encourage literacy in our community and build relationships between adults and high school students through a shared reading experience.
The Elizabeth Fry Society of Saint John NB Inc. (\$900)	Day long retreat where women will be able to experience a restful nurturing environment, participate in activities that promote wellness, and have time for themselves in the company of women with common interests.
The Multiple Sclerosis Society of Canada, Atlantic Division (\$900)	The Funding Assistance Program was established to help ease the financial burden faced by those affected by MS. The MS Society helps people with MS pay for mobility devices such as walkers, canes, patient lifts and wheelchairs as well as expenses related to medical response services and emergency transportation.
The Nature Conservancy of Canada (\$2,400)	Conservation Volunteers Program. Volunteers will assist us to steward our conservation lands during two events in the greater Saint John Area this field season: 1) Musquash Trailblazers event 2) Shampers Bluff Nature Reserve,
The Nature Trust of New Brunswick (NTNB) (\$1,700)	Funding will enable the NBNT to enhance management of the two Saint's Rest Nature Preserve properties (about 122 acres in total) through trail development, access to visitors from the Tourism Information Centre on Route 1 and the Irving Nature Park, help develop a management plan, public educational and interpretive sessions and events (e.g. nature walks, trail building, fundraising).
The Resource Centre for Youth for Youth (TRC) of Greater Saint John (\$5,000)	After-school free drop-in program that serves low-income/at-risk youth in 2 priority neighborhoods. Services include, recreation activities, Case Management, on-site support for homeless youth, Sexual Health Centre, visiting Mental Health and Addictions counselors.
Stella Maris Senior Group (\$400)	Our mission has been and will continue to be keeping seniors mentally alert, physically mobile and socially interactive.
The Saint John Learning Exchange (\$7,500)	Voila!, an eco-friendly cleaning company, employs individuals and generates revenue that will be used as a sustainable funding stream to support our programs: providing sustainable, unrestricted funding to a non-profit community organization in Saint John; living wage employment to work ready individuals; and a healthier environment for all!
Vibrant Communities (\$5,000)	Support to Social Plan which will identify clear priorities that will help guide the investment of resources in our communities. Collectively agreed upon priorities will strengthen the efforts of both funders and service providers in aligning our efforts for the greatest impact.
Youth Enhancement Program Inc (\$5,000)	This project helps find funding to pay for the nutrition programs at HWSF school including snacks for after school programs and the Kindergarten Readiness program, breakfast and lunches. It also helps pay for the food needed for the cooking classes.
