

<p>Ability New Brunswick Capacite Nouveau-Brunswick Inc.</p>	<p>The Rehabilitation Counselling Outreach service works to develop plans to encompass the needs of an individual with a mobility disability and their family. Each plan is unique; it may find recreation programs to build self-esteem, home supports for independence, respite for caregivers, or equipment solutions for mobility. Saint John is a priority due to the number of low income families.</p>
<p>ACAP Saint John</p>	<p>ACAP Saint John intends to form a new partnership within the community to welcome new residents through environmental education and hands-on participation in environmental events. These will be centered around the seasons and will aim to bring new residents into natural areas of Saint John to participate in stewardship activities.</p>
<p>Big Brothers Big Sisters of Saint John</p>	<p>Big Brothers Big Sisters provides mentoring programs for children and youth in Saint John, Kings and Charlotte Counties. Approximately 400 young people are mentored each year in a variety of programs including one-to-one and group mentoring which takes place both in-school and in the community. The goal is to provide additional training for mentors in key topic areas in order to better support "mentees" through the difficult challenges faced by youth today.</p>
<p>Big Brothers Big Sisters of Saint John</p>	<p>The Game On! program uses a mentor approach to provide boys/young men with information/support to make informed choices about a range of healthy lifestyle practices. Through non-traditional physical activities, complemented with healthy eating support, participants engage in life skills, communication, and emotional health discussions designed to engage participants in pursuit of life-long healthy lifestyles.</p>
<p>Boys and Girls Club of Saint John</p>	<p>The Boys and Girls Club offers a 10-week themed Summer Day Camp for children and youth in the city of Saint John. This is a paid weekly program, however, approximately 75% of the children and youth who attend the program are financially subsidized.</p>
<p>Community Autism Centre Inc</p>	<p>“Get Ready for Life” is a project that encompasses goals of employment and inclusion for those with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). Currently, the Centre assists over 1500 families with autism support and many individuals with ASD are not working but want and can be working.</p>
<p>Crescent Valley Resource Centre</p>	<p>The CV Family Literacy initiative will deliver a variety of literacy activities to families, including new programs such as literacy "camps" and events throughout the year, as well as: book-wagons, storytents, reading corners, community library and presentations of books.</p>
<p>Crescent Valley Resource Centre</p>	<p>This initiative will comprise of several components: providing healthy meals and snacks to residents and families during CVRC programs; teaching components where residents can try new foods; learn how to prepare nutritious meals and hands-on vegetable gardening component.</p>

Family Plus Life Solutions	Working with the Family Resource Center this project will have one therapists pilot a program that works through the Family Resource Play Centres. The therapist will build trust by fostering a relationship through the participation in the play group weekly or through some educational presentations. As the comfort is established, the therapist will begin to have weekly “office times” that parents will be able to drop in and have their concerns addressed.
Family Plus Life Solutions	The addition of psychiatrists to the clinical team has provided an opportunity to introduce alternative therapy techniques that would achieve more successful health outcomes with certain clients and potentially create greater business efficiencies. Group psychotherapy is an evidenced based approach that utilizes individual, interpersonal and group dynamics as a change agent in achieving individual therapeutic goals and outcomes.
Heart and Stroke Foundation of New Brunswick	This project will provide the Saint John Family Resource Center with 50 Infant CPR Anytime® kits. The families served by the Resource Centre will be given the opportunity to learn lifesaving skills for their infants that they may not otherwise be able to access.
Housing Alternatives Inc.	In Spring 2016 Housing Alternatives Inc. will begin operating the first official Housing First program in Saint John. Housing First seeks to support the highest risk and most chronically homeless population by providing a home as a first priority and establishing wrap-around, recovery-oriented supports to promote stability and overall well-being.
John Howard Society	This project will support the establishment of an art program to provide additional support to the holistic approach to client recovery. Art will augment the existing specialized program.
Kids Help Phone	Mental ill-health in youth imposes considerable barriers to normal academic, emotional and social development. Kids Help Phone is dedicated to improving the mental health and well-being of youth – particularly those at-risk. Live Chat is an innovative way to reach youth through the communication channel they prefer.
Kings Way LifeCare Alliance	Junior Volunteer Summer Day Camp provides children with the unique opportunity to spend a portion of their summer with people living in nursing homes. Having children come in to the homes to learn about these challenges and disabilities, while exercising their new volunteer skills helps to reduce negative stereotypes often associated with nursing homes.
Kings Way LifeCare Alliance	Saint John has the highest child poverty rate in Canada. Within Centennial School, 20 families have been identified as at risk of experiencing hunger over the weekend. The residents at Kings Way and Kennebec Manor wanted to help so the Back Pack program was born! Residents cook, bake and pack up a variety of foods to put in packs to ensure children have food on weekends.
Lily Lake Pavilion Inc.	Three of the Lily Lake Pavilion Community Programs are MOVIES in the PARK, SENIORS in the PARK and AWESOME ADVENTURES in the PARK. Funding will help support these programs.
MS Society of Canada	Symptoms of MS include impaired mobility, sight, cognition and incontinence. This project funds individuals with MS in the Saint John region. It enables people with MS to access funds to renovate their home for safety and accessibility. As well to fund mobility devices, access to exercise programs and recreational activities which reduce stress, and improve a sense of well-being and community involvement.

Nature Conservancy of Canada	Our land is your land -- NCC offers hands-on opportunities to connect with, learn about and care for local nature through our Conservation Volunteers Program. This funding will support three events in the Greater Saint John Area.
New Brunswick Association for Community Living	Families raising a child with a disability face additional challenges and stress. This project will develop resources that will assist families in the Greater Saint John area to recruit and manage respite services. This will include a respite provider data base and educational materials for both families and respite providers. Families will also receive educational opportunities to strengthen their capacities for recruiting and managing respite services.
New Brunswick International Sculpture Symposium Inc.	Workshops will be held on site for all ages. Half day workshops for 5-9 year olds and 9-14 year olds. This will be done by qualified art instructors using clay, paint and other materials. Funding will subsidize the attendance of children at workshops with the qualified instructors/artists.
New Brunswick Youth Orchestra	Sistema NB Saint John is a free after-school program. Underserved children are provided instruments, at no cost to their family, and become part of something very special, the orchestra! In 2016, the existing program will expand by adding bassoon and percussion to the program, the last instruments needed to provide a full orchestra program.
One Change	This funding will support phase 1 of the project to serve 250 adults and children daily and phase 2 to implement the North End Collective Kitchen which will consist of a residents cooking together in bulk for their families.
Outflow Ministry	The project is the next stage of Outflow's social enterprise initiative. The purpose of this initiative is to use a business model to serve people living in poverty by providing opportunities for employment and training.
Roots of Empathy	In 2016-17 the reach of the program will be increased by adding an additional 6 programs with newly trained Instructors. The new Instructors will recruit new Instructors, register them for training and help them to pair with the classes and the families with young infants.
Saint John Community Christmas Exchange	Each year the Exchange develops and maintains a new registration list of needy individuals/families in the Greater Saint John Area. The Exchange ensures all that who apply receive help for their Christmas dinner.
Saint John Community Food Basket Inc.	A registered dietician will analyze food items based on nutritional values and health profiles. Education and training, reference materials and consultation will also be provided. The food budget will be analyzed using information collected during the project. New partnerships will be formed with local food vendors. Personal shopping carts will be provided to clients to address transportation and mobility issues.
Saint John Jewish Historical Museum	This project will establish mobile museum exhibits. The exhibits will focus on the history of the Jewish community of Saint John. Audio-visual and guest speakers will also be part of the presentations where possible.
Saint John Learning Exchange	The Social Enterprise Stone Soup will develop school food programming, Through their partnership with the Boys and Girls Club, 100 whole-food lunches will be prepared daily for children in need. This new program will enable Stone Soup to increase the number of healthy hot lunches brought into schools to 200+ daily, allow for the training of 10 participants, and employment of 2.

Saint John School Milk Fund	The SJ School Milk Fund subsidizes individual milk cartons. There continue to be 14 schools in Anglophone District South receiving such assistance. In the course of the current year the number of children receiving milk has increased to 800 at an estimated cost of .35 cents per serving five days a week.
Sophia Recovery Centre	Sophia Recovery Centre is engaging in a process to measure Social Return on Investment (SROI). An innovative approach, SROI assigns a financial value to a social impact, such as addiction recovery.
St John's Stone Church The Anglican Parish of St. Mark	This project will promote food security by teaching people with limited means to cook healthy affordable meals through a weekly course using the premise of "The Basic Shelf" to address food needs of Central Saint John.
The Learning Partnership	Investigate! Invent! Innovate! (I-Cubed) is an integrated math, science and technology program delivered by teachers to grade 7-8 students that aims to instill a passion for STEM subjects and foster innovation, critical thinking, collaboration, communication and entrepreneurship.
The Resource Centre	TRC's Community Cluster is a re-fit of the 3rd floor, reinventing it as collaborative space designed to accommodate non-profit agencies.
The Saint John Human Development Council Inc.	This funding will support moderate to high needs individuals who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, specifically the transition from homelessness to a home and this includes apartment set up.
YMCA of Greater Saint John	The Inclusive Camp allows ALL children, regardless of their abilities, to have a camping opportunity. It provides campers with special needs a support counsellor, at no additional charge, that will assist them when needed throughout the days activities.
YMCA of Greater Saint John	The Rainbows Program is dedicated to providing emotional healing for children, youth and adults grieving a loss or a life altering crisis.
YMCA of Greater Saint John	Funding will support will ALL children to participate in a camping experience throughout the summer. The YMCA is working with 10 priority schools in Saint John to determine children that would benefit but may not normally have the opportunity.
YMCA of Greater Saint John	This project provides opportunities for ALL youth to improve their leadership skills and participate in activities that will empower them to be confident, engaged citizens. The program fills a gap for youth programming in our community and will promote leadership and community engagement for our future leaders.
Youth Enhancement Program Inc	This program works to support funding for nutrition programs at Hazen White /St. Francis School including breakfast, lunch, snacks before Mentoring, recreation programs, the Kindergarden Readiness program. This grant will help provide "backpacks" of emergency food for weekends for families in need.
YWCA	The YWCA's Stand Your Ground project will help parents access and develop tools, resources and skills to address child to parent bullying and abuse. Delivered over the course of 10 hours, parents will learn to identify and understand parental abuse and learn coping, boundary setting and behaviour skills to address these issues within the home.
