# OUR YEAR IN GRANTING

Each year we grant funds through a regular schedule; the Community Service Awards, Smart & Caring Grants, and our Anniversary Grant.

This year we also had also two additional granting cycles: The Old Ladies Home of Saint John Fund Grants and the RBC Future Launch Challenge in collaboration with Community Foundations of Canada and RBC.

Here is a brief overview of the grants awarded in 2018-2019:

### Community Service Award – Individual

**Judith Urquhart** has been actively making Saint John a better place for decades. She has held various positions in the nonprofit and social services sector and has made large contributions to mental health care accessibility in our community.

She's devoted her life to our community and has worked tirelessly to remove barriers to mental health care accessibility. Judy's years of dedicated service has reverberated through the community and her impact is still being felt. She has made a difference in so many lives.

She has donated her \$5,000 prize to Gentle Path Counselling Services, where she was Executive Director for two decades.

On top of their work at KV Oasis Youth Centre, the committee also does many other things in the community, from volunteering at Marathon by the Sea to running games at Market Square on New Year's Eve to delivering flyers for the Town of Rothesay.

This group is passionate and innovative and works hard to make life better for youth in the community. They volunteer their spare time to help in their community, while they all also have a very full work and school schedule.

Their \$5,000 prize was donated to the KV Oasis Youth Centre.

### **Anniversary Grant**

**The Saint John Learning Exchange** was the recipient of our 43rd Anniversary Grant and have been granted \$43,000.00 for their project, 'Learner Led Innovations'.

Grants of \$4,300 were also given to Belleisle Regional High School and Shining Horizons Therapeutic Riding Association for their applications to the Anniversary Grant competition.

# **OUR YEAR IN GRANTING**

### Smart & Caring Grants

Each June, The Community Foundation distributes our Smart & Caring Grants to successful applicants within Greater Saint John.

The applications are assessed based on their alignment with our mission and vision, as well as identified community needs.

For 2018-2019, The Foundation received over \$320,000.00 in funding requests for the Smart & Caring Grants and awarded \$253,112.98 at our luncheon in June.

### Old Ladies Home of Saint John Fund Granting

The 'Old Ladies Home', also known as Courtenay House, established in 1919, was for many years a residence for many elderly women in Saint John. When it closed its doors in 1977, an application was made to the courts on behalf of the Old Ladies Home to transfer all remaining assets to The Community Foundation and create an endowment fund. The Old Ladies Home Fund became the first Fund placed under the trusteeship of the Foundation. The stated purpose of the Fund is "To provide for aged and in need men and women" throughout Greater Saint John.

In 2019, we held a special granting cycle, which awarded funding for Senior-focused projects ranging in amounts from \$5,000 to \$30,000 per project.

### **RBC Future Launch Community Challenge**

The RBC Future Launch Community Challenge (hosted by Community Foundations of Canada and RBC Foundation) enables youth to apply for funding to support their bold ideas to address urgent community priorities. It is an opportunity for young people to lead, learn new skills, gain experience, and build relationships in their local communities – all things that will help them prepare for the future of work.

Congratulations to Harbour View High School for being the recipient of The Community Foundation's successful RBC Future Launch Challenge grant in the amount of \$30,000 to fund their project, 'Creating a sustainable school.' Their project focuses on reducing the environmental impact food and beverage consumption within their school. This includes both the sourcing of food and the aim to eliminate the use of single use plastics.



# **NEW FUNDS IN 2018-2019**

### The David 'DK' Kelly Memorial Bursary Fund



David "DK" Kelly was a true humanitarian whose tireless efforts to promote selflessness and raise both funds and awareness for cancer are the tenants from which this special fund are based.

After being diagnosed with cancer in 2014, DK made it his mission to take the disease head-on and inspire others worldwide. When friends, family and supports from all over the hockey world and beyond rallied around him in support, #TeamDK was formed.

The essence of #TeamDK will be embraced by Saint Johners and around the world for years and decades to come with the establishment of the **David "DK" Kelly Memorial Bursary Fund.** 

### The Naval Memorial Fund

On May 15th, 2019, representatives from the Royal United Services Institute of New Brunswick (RUSI-NB), HMCS Brunswicker and the Community Foundation gathered to permanently establish The Naval Memorial Fund. Annual earnings generated by the Fund will support required maintenance and repairs to be the soon to be erected – Naval Memorial to be located along Harbour Passage.

In addition to preserving the Monument, this Fund will also support the pursuit of post-secondary education through the awarding of bursaries, to be called "The Naval Memorial Fund Bursary". Eligible candidates for the bursaries will be students who are or who have been a member of the HMCS Brunswicker or of any New Brunswickbased unit of the Royal Canadian Sea Cadets.





### The United Way Endowment Fund

To commemorate the United Way's 60th anniversary, the Board of Directors of the United Way have decided to permanently endow \$60,000 to the Community Foundation and establish the United Way Endowment Fund.

Earnings generated from the investment of the \$60,000 and future donations will be granted to the United Way each year to support their mission and vision.



So, through the Bob McVicar Saint John Heritage Conservation Fund, we hope to encourage further growth in our Uptown and ensure Bob's passion for the neighbourhood endures. Annual income from the fund will support projects that enhance Heritage Conservation Areas within the City of Saint John.
