

COURSE: EVALUATE YOUR IMPACT

Organizations are often asked to demonstrate their impact – the difference they are making each day to improve the quality of life in their communities. This course will teach you how to measure processes and outcomes and articulate the impact to your stakeholders, including funders, volunteers, and participants themselves.

Overview

The Community Foundation of Greater Saint John is offering a robust and 'real world' learning opportunity where a cohort of 10-12 participants will learn how to develop an evaluation plan, implement this plan, and use the findings to improve their programs and communicate their impact.

Objectives

By the end of the course, participants will:

- Understand common evaluation concepts and ideas, and appropriate uses of different types of evaluation
- Discover the processes and activities involved in evaluation planning and execution through hands-on assignments that can help inform your own organization
- Become familiar with qualitative and quantitative research methods commonly used in evaluation
- Learn how to use evaluation findings to improve programs and services

This course is designed for anyone who is currently involved in, or is considering embarking on, an evaluation journey. It does not require any previous understanding of evaluation or research.
